The George Alexander Foundation (GAF) was established in 1972 by businessman, inventor and philanthropist George Alexander as a way of sharing his wealth and giving back to the community.

Born in London, George migrated to Australia at age 15 under the Big Brother Movement, an organisation that brought young British men to Australia to work on the land given to soldiers returning from WWI.

He spent time working on a rural dairy farm and later at a local garage, where he decided he wanted to become an A-grade mechanic.

He realised his goal by enrolling in evening classes in mechanics and management at The Gordon Institute. George's love of learning also led him to study Industrial Management and Executive Training at RMIT.

George went on to combine his creativity, mechanical knowledge and engineering skills to invent some highly successful

products. This included Neta, a line of brass hose nozzles that are still manufactured today. The business flourished, and George eventually sold it in 1976.

With the revenue generated from Neta, George invested in property in the Gold Coast. Continued property investments generated the wealth used to establish The George Alexander Foundation, ensuring it would be put to good use.

George deeply believed in the transformative power of education and dedicated the core of GAF's programs to undergraduate scholarships.

Recognising the obstacles he faced in his youth, George wanted to provide exceptional young people from rural, regional and remote backgrounds with opportunities to succeed.

More than just money

Your scholarship is paid in instalments during the length of your degree and will be issued through your institution.

Sustaining your scholarship



Maintain academic performance

You must meet the academic standards set by your institution to remain eligible for your scholarship.



Submit your Annual Scholar Report

This is a check-in to see how you're progressing in your degree, what milestones you may have achieved and how you're adapting to new challenges.

The report is usually submitted near the end of the academic year. Don't worry, your institution will remind you when it's due!



Notify your institution of any changes

If you decide to change your major, discontinue or defer your degree, reduce your study load, or transfer to another campus, please contact your institution's Scholarships or Advancement team to let them know as soon as possible.

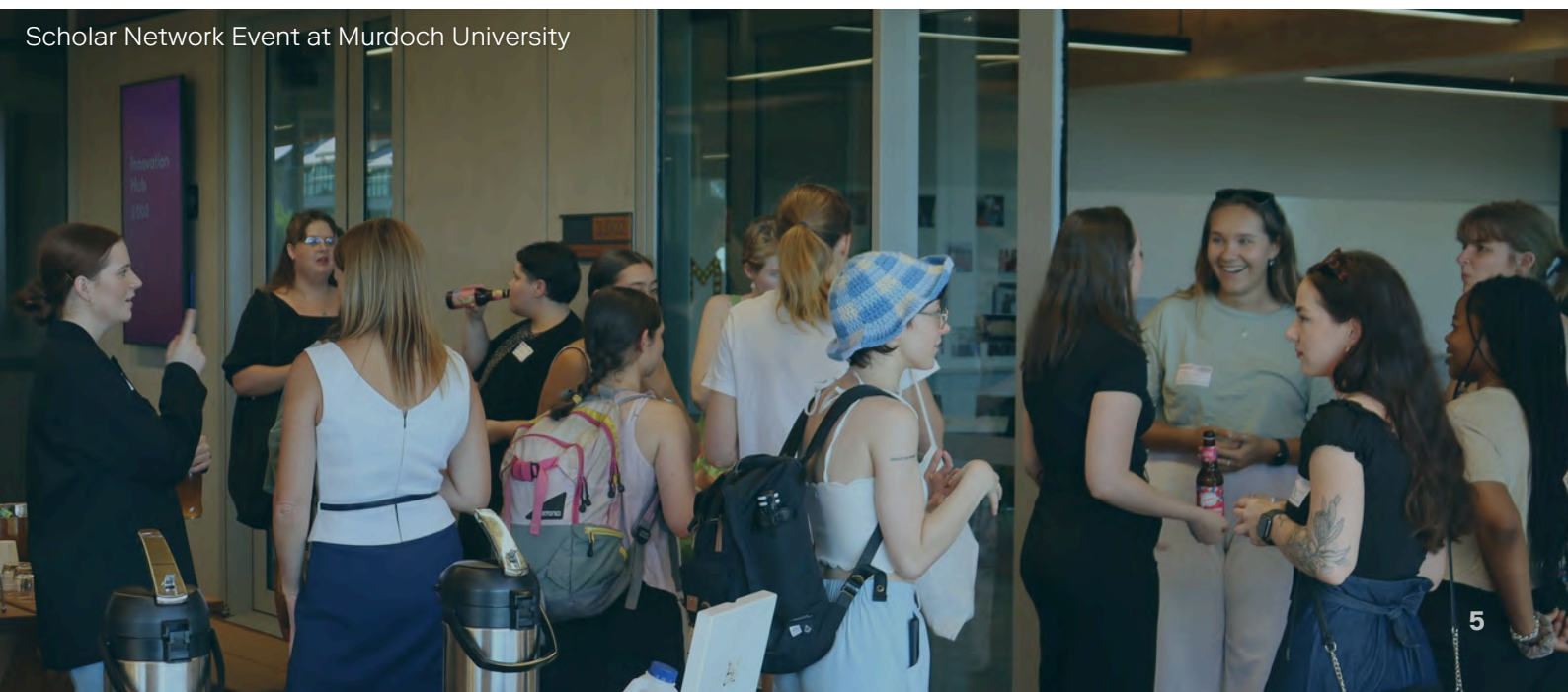


Get involved

A symbol that sticks



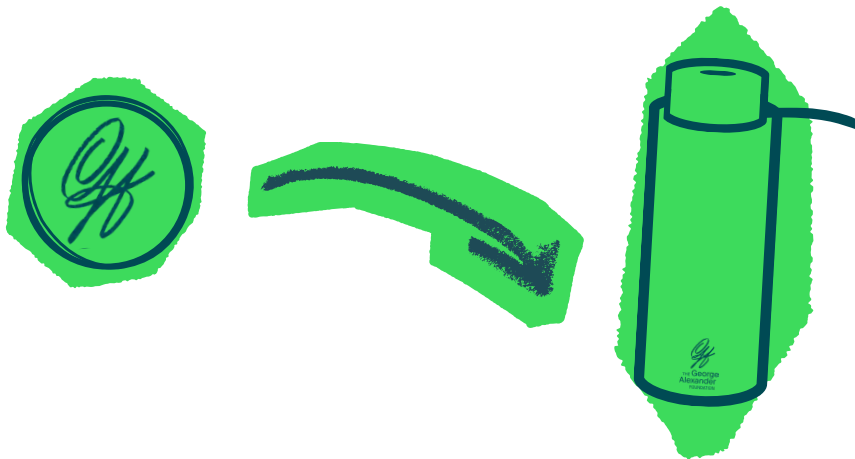
Scholar Network Event at Swinburne University
